FIRST

- 3. The first person the Bible says was successful is Joseph the Righteous, and the reason is that God was with him (Gen. 39:2).
- 4. The first person mentioned in the Bible to have been taken captive was Lot, when Sodom was taken (Gen. 14:12,14).
- 5. The first collective punishment was the flood (Gen. 6), the second was the punishment for building the tower of Babel (Gen. 11), the third was the burning of Sodom (Gen. 19), and the fourth collective punishment was in the time of Pharaoh and Moses when God sent the plagues upon the Egyptians (Ex. 7-12).
- 6. The first revelation of God was when God appeared to Adam (Gen. 3) and the second was when He appeared to Abram (Gen. 15).
- 7. The first angelic revelation was when the angel of the Lord appeared to Hagar (Gen. 16:7).
- 8. The first verse in the Bible about vegetarian food was when God told Adam and Eve. "I give you every seed-

- bearing plant on the face of the whole earth and every tree that has fruit with seed in it. They will be yours for food". (Gen. 1:29).
- 9. The first angel mentioned in the Holy Bible was one of the cherubim and his job was to guard the tree of life (Gen. 3:24).
- 10. The first mention in the Bible of revenge is when God said to Cain, "If anyone kills Cain, he will suffer vengeance seven times over". (Gen. 4:15).
- 11. The first war between kings recorded in the Bible was the war of Kedorlaomer in which four kings fought five kings (Gen. 14:14).
- 12. The first time laughter was mentioned in the Bible was when Sarah laughed in her heart when she heard that she would get a son in her old age (Gen. 18:12).
- 13. The first sin was mentioned for the first time when God told Cain "If you do not do well, sin lies at the door; and its desire is for you, but you should rule over it". (Gen. 4:7).
- 14. The first man to marry two women is Lamech (a descendant of Cain) and the names of his wives are Adah and Zillah (Gen. 4:19).
- 15. The first woman to be cursed was Lot's wife when she was turned into a pillar of salt (Gen. 19:26).
- 16. The first person the Bible says was a priest was Melchizedek (Gen. 14:18).
- 17. The first man to be cursed was Cain (Gen. 4:9,11) and the second was Canaan (Gen. 9:25).
- 18. The first time the expression "The house of God" was mentioned was when Jacob said, "How awesome is this place! This is no other than the house of God; this is the gate of heaven". (Gen. 28:17).

- 19. The first son to grieve his parents by his marriage was Esau, when he married two of the daughters of the Hittites and "they were a grief of mind to Isaac and Rebekah". (Gen. 26: 34, 35).
- 20. The first lie mentioned in the Bible was when the serpent told Adam and Eve, "You will not die". (Gen. 3:4).
- 21. The first person to do good to those who offended him was Joseph the Righteous, who did good to his brothers (Gen. 45).
- 22. The first time the expression the sons of God is used in the Bible was before the flood, "the sons of God saw that the daughters of men were beautiful" (Gen. 6:2).
- 23. The first family to know music was Jubal's family and they played the harp and the flute (Gen. 4:2 1).
- 24. The first time the word "tithes" was mentioned was when the patriarch Abraham met Melchizedek and " gave him a tithe of everything" (Gen. 14:21). The second time tithing was mentioned was when Jacob vowed that if God would be with him "of all that You give me I will give You a tenth". (Gen. 28:22).
- 25. The first one to have dreams that came true was Joseph the Righteous (Gen. 37).
- 26. The first sin mentioned in the Holy Bible is the sin of pride, which is the devil's sin, and is mentioned in Is. 14: 13,14 where he says "I will ascend into heaven, I will exalt my throne above the stars of God... I will be like the Most High".
- 27. The first time the consecration of the house of God is mentioned was when Jacob took "the stone he had put at his head and set it up as a pillar and poured oil on top of it. He called the name of that place Bethel" (or the house of God) (Gen. 28:18,19).

- 28. The first person to struggle with God and prevail was Jacob (Gen. 32:28).
- 29. The first man the Lord ordered to meditate in His law day and night was Joshua son of Nun (Jos. 1:8).
- 30. The first person the Bible says made a vow was Jacob (Gen. 28:20). He vowed to give God a tenth of everything if God kept him.




WHO

- 31. The two sorcerers who opposed Moses were Jannes and Jambres who were mentioned by St. Paul(2 Tim. 3:8).
- 32. The last enemy to be destroyed is death (1 Cor. 15:26).
- 33. The judge who made a vow and was very sad when he fulfilled it was Jephthah, who had vowed to God saying "If You deliver the Ammonites into my hands, whatever comes out of the doors of my house to meet me when I return in triumph from the Ammonities shall be the Lord's, and I will sacrifice it as a burnt offering". (Judg. 11:30,31). The first one to come out of his house to meet him dancing to the sound of timbres was his only daughter (Judg. 11:34).
- 34. The prophet who was ruddy with a fine appearance and handsome features was David (1 Sam. 16:12.,1 Sam. 17:42).
- 35. St. Paul the apostle's partner in preaching the gospel to the Corinthians was Appollos (1 Cor. 3:5).
- 36. The husband and wife who made of their house a church were Acquila and Priscilla (Rom. 16:3~5).
- 37. It was to St. Paul that the Lord said, "As you have testified for Me in Jerusalem, so you must also bear witness at Rome". (Acts 23:11).
- 38. The Bishop who was young was St. Timothy to whom St. Paul wrote, "Let no one despise your youth" (1 Tim, 4:12).

- 39. The child that God loved before he was born was Jacob (Rom, 9:11-13; Gen. 25: 23).
- 40. The person who was called by each of the Holy Trinity separately was St. Paul the apostle (Saul of Tarsus).
 - a. He was called by the Son on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:4).
 - b. He was called by the Holy Spirit who said "Now separate to me Bamabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them" (Acts 13:2).
 - c. He was called by the Father as we see what St. Paul wrote "But when it pleased God, who separated me from my mother's womb and called me through His grace, to reveal His son in me so that I might preach Him among the Gentiles, I did not immediately confer with flesh and blood" (Gal. 1:15,16).
- 41. The child who served from his childhood in the Temple was Samuel (1 Sam. 1:24, 1 Sam. 2:11).
- 42. The child who studied the Scriptures from his childhood was Timothy (2 Tim. 3:15).
- 43. The person to whom St. Paul preached the gospel while he was in prison and whom he baptized with all his household was the jailer of Philippi (Acts 16:31-34).
- 44. The prophet who was a beautiful child and whose parents hid three months after his birth was Moses (Heb. 11:23).
- 45. The four epistles written by St. Paul from Rome were to the Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and to Philomen (See the end of each of these epistles).
- 46. Abraham lived 175 years (Gen. 25:7), and Isaac lived 180 years (Gen. 35:28), and Jacob lived 147 years (Gen. 47:28).

- 47. God punished Moses by not allowing him to enter the promised land, because he did not obey His order to hit the rock.
- 48.. God punished David for his sin of adultery (2 Sam. 12), and another time when he counted the people (2 Sam. 24).
- 49. Simon (Peter) (Matt. 10:2). Lebbaeus (Theddaeus) (Matt. 10:3). Mark (John) (Acts 12:12). Matthew (Levi). Paul (Saul) (Acts 9).
- 50. The oldest man in history is Methuselah who lived 969 years (Gen. 5:27).
- 51. The one who fought his father and died without achieving anything was Absalom, who fought his father David (2 Sam. 15:18).
- 52. The young shepherd who killed a lion was David (1 Sam. 17: 34, 35).
- 53. Samuel the child communicated a message from God to Eli the priest (1 Sam. 3).
- 54. Samuel anointed Saul king and Saul was evil (1 Sam. 10), and he anointed David king and David was good (1 Sam. 16).
- 55. The stupid miserly man was Nabal of Carmel. David sent a message threatening to kill him but his wife Abigail saved him with her wisdom, and so David forgave him (1 Sam. 25).
- 56. The prophet who uttered true prophecies about Christ but perished was Balaam (Num. 23-25) (Rev. 2:14).

- 57. The commander Barak son of Abinoam refused to go to war unless Deborah the prophetess went with him (Judge 4:8).
- 58. Moses needed seventy assistants because of his great responsibilities (Num. 11).
- 59. The earth opened up and swallowed Korah, Dathan, and Abiram because they wanted to offer incense, although they were not priests (Num. 16:32).
- 60. Herod the king fulfilled his oath and killed John the Baptist, and offered his head on a silver platter to Herodia, and so he perished (Matt. 14:10).
- 61. The person whose life was lengthened by 15 years was Hezekiah the King (Isa. 38:5).



THE APOSTLES

- 62. The first Holy Council to meet was convened by the apostles in Jerusalem (Acts 15). It was called to discuss accepting the Gentiles.
- 63. The apostle of the uncircumcised, that is the Gentiles, was St. Paul and the apostle of the circumcised, that is the Jews, was St. Peter.
- 64. The two heresies that Lord Jesus mentioned to St. John in the Book of Revelation were the teachings of the Nicolaitans (Rev. 2:15) and the teachings of Balaam (Rev. 2:14).
- 65. John and his brother, James, the sons of Zebedee were given the name Boanerges meaning the sons of thunder (Mark 3:17).
- 66. Peter the apostle had three names: Peter, Simon, and Cephas.
- 67. St. Paul was mocked in Athens and was said by the Athenians to be a babbler (Acts 17:18,32).
- 68. Festus said of St. Paul that he was out of his mind (Acts 26:24).
- 69. Felix, the governor. was afraid in front of St. Paul (Acts 24:25).
- 70. King Agrippa said to St. Paul during his trial. "in such a short time you can persuade me to be a Christian?" (Acts 26:28).

- 71. Nathaniel was the first disciple to say to Lord Jesus Christ, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God" (John. 1:49).
- 72. The disciple whom the Lord Jesus rebuked for his little faith was Peter, when he was afraid while walking on the water and started to drown. The Lord told him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" (Matt. 14:30,31).
- 73. After the Lord blessed St. Peter (Matt. 16:17), He rebuked him when Peter rejected the cross for Him saying. "This shall not happen to You". The Lord answered, "Get the behind Me Satan! You are a stumbling block to Me". (Matt. 16:22, 23).
- 74. St. Paul asked God three times to remove the thorn in his flesh, but God refused and said to him, "My grace is sufficient for you" (2 Cor. 12:7-9).
- 75. The Lord breathed on the faces of His disciples so that they receive the Holy Spirit. This happened in the evening of the Resurrection Sunday (John.20:19-23).
- 76. St. Paul was almost worshipped in Lystra when he healed the crippled man. The people called him Hermes after one of their gods (Acts 14:8-14).
- 77. The indebted slave was Onesimus: St. Paul in his letter to Philemon promised to pay the debt (Philem. 18,19).
- 78. The congregation fell on the neck of St. Paul and wept when he told them that they would not see him again (Acts 20:37,38).
- 79. The first disciple to be killed with the sword by Herod was James the son of Zebedeee, John's brother (Acts 12:1).
- 80. The apostle who was stoned and left for dead was St. Paul in Lystra (Acts 14:19).
- 81. Thaddeus had another name which was Bartholomew (Matt. 10:3).

- 82. The places where all the names of the twelve disciples are mentioned are (Matt. 10:2-4). (Mark. 3:16-19), (Luke. 6:14-16), (Acts 1:13, except forJudas Iscariot).
- 83. (Simon Peter), (Matthew-Levi), (Simon-the Zealot).
- 84. The Lord said to Philip alone, "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know Me? Whoever has seen Me has seen the Father" (John. 14:9,10).
- 85. The Lord said to Thomas alone, "Put your finger here; see My hands. Reach out your hand and put it in My side. Do not doubt but believe ... because you have seen Me you have believed, blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed" (John. 20:27,29).
- 86. The Lord said to Peter alone, "Get thee behind Me Satan! You are a stumbling block to Me" (Matt. 16:23), and also "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by man, but by My Father in heaven. And I tell you that you are Peter... "(Matt. 16:17,18), also see (Matt. 26:34) "You shall deny Me three times".
- 87. The Lord said to John alone, "Here is your mother". It was about the Virgin Mary (John. 19:27).
- 88. The Lord said to Nathanael alone, "I saw you while you are still under the fig tree before Philip called you", and also "You believe because I told you I saw you under the fig tree. You shall see greater things than that" (John. 1:48-50).
- 89. The Lord said to Judas Iscariot alone, "Friend, do what you came for" (Matt. 26:50), and "Judas, are you betraying the Son of Man with a kiss?" (Luke. 22:48), and "What you are about to do, do quickly" (John. 13:27).
- 90. There were Peter and Andrew his brother; James and John the sons of Zebedee (Matt. 10:2) and James son of Alphaeus and his brother Judas (Luke. 6:16) Acts 1:13).

91. Philip and Andrew are the two disciples who interceded on behalf of the Greeks, who wanted to meet Lord Jesus (John. 12:20-22).



THE ASSISTANTS AND DISCIPLES OF ST.PAUL

- 92. Among the assistants of St. Paul were Mark the Apostle (Col.4:10) (2 Tim. 4:11). Barnabas (Acts 13:2-5). Timothy (1 Cor.16:10). Apollos (1 Cor. 3:6). T'ychicus (Eph. 6:25) (2 Tim. 4:12). Aristarchus, Justus, Epaphras, and Luke the doctor (Col. 4:10-14), Onesimus (Col. 4:19), and Silvanus (1 Thess. 1:1).
- 93. Demas was an assistant to St. Paul but was lost (2 Tim. 4:10).
- 94. Phoebe, the deaconess, used to carry St. Paul's letters to different countries (Rom. 16:1,2,28).
- 95. Titus, the bishop of Crete (Tit. 1:5) and Timothy, the bishop of Ephesus were young (1 Tim, 4:12).
- 96. St. Paul called Timothy his son (1 Tim. 1:2,18) (2 Tim. 1:2) and also called Onesimus his son (Philem 10).
- 97. Timothy, St. Paul's disciple was often mentioned in the introductions of St. Paul's letters (2 Cor. 1:11) (Phil. 1:1) (Col. 1:1) (1 Thess. 1:1) (Phil. 1).



THE HOLY SPIRIT

- 98. The first verse about the Holy Spirit is "and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters" (Gen. 1:2).
- 99. The first two kings the Holy Spirit came upon were Saul (1 Sam. 10) and David (1 Sam. 16).
- 100. God promised in (Ezek. 36:27) saying. "And I will put My Spirit in you".
- 101. God promised to give gifts to men in (Joel 2:28) saying "I will pour out My Spirit on all people; your sons and daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, your young men will see visions".
- 102. It was written of Saul" and the Spirit of the Lord began to stir him while he was in Mahaneh Dan" (Judge. 13:25).
- 103. It is written in (Acts 28-25) "The Holy Spirit spoke the truth to your forefathers when he said through Isaiah the prophet.."
- 104. It is written about the Holy Spirit's work through inspiration: "Because no prophecy ever came by human will, but holy men of God spoke as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit" (2 Pet. 1:21).
- 105. (Acts 28:25) (2 Pet. 1:21).
- 106. The chapter that deals with the gifts of the Spirit is (1 Cor. 12).
- 107. The chapter that deals with speaking in tongues is (1 Cor. 14).

- 108. The Spirit of God departed from Saul after He had come upon him (1 Sam. 16:14).
- 109. The Lord took from the Spirit that was upon Moses and gave to seventy elders (Num. 11:17,25).
- 110. The ingredients used for making the anointing oilare mentioned in (Ex. 30:22-25).
- 111. The people of Samaria received the Holy Spirit by the laying on of the hands of Peter and John the apostles (Acts 8:14,17). The people of Ephesus received the Holy Spirit by the laying on of the hands of the apostle Paul (Acts 19:6).
- 112. The holy anointing is mentioned in (1 John. 2:20, 27).
- 113. Receiving the Holy Spirit through breathing is mentioned in (1 Cor. 20:22).
- 114. Baptism precedes the coming of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:38) (Acts 19:5,6) (Acts 8:16,17).
- 115. The indwelling of the Spirit in us is mentioned in (1 Cor. 3:16). "Don't you know that you yourselves are God's temple and that God's Spirit lives in you". It is also mentioned in (1 Cor. 6:19).
- 116. The Holy Spirit's procession from the Father is found in (John. 15:26), "the Spirit of Truth who comes from the Father.."
- 117. "The Holy Spirit ... will teach you everything" (John. 14:26).
- 118. He will give you another Advocate to be with you forever" (John. 14:16).
- 119. "He (the Holy Spirit) will reprove the world of sin (John. 16:8).
- 120. The Holy Spirit is called the Comforter (John. 14:16).

- 121. The Lord said, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be My witnesses" (Acts 1:8).
- 122. The Holy Spirit works within craftsmen (Ex. 28:3) and in those who made Aaron's clothes, and in Bezalel "to make artistic designs for work in gold, silver and bronze, to cut and set stones, to work in wood, and to engage in all kinds of craftsmanship" (Ex.31:3-5).
- 123. The fellowship of the Holy Spirit is mentioned in (2 Cor. 13:14) and in (Heb. 6:4).
- 124. It is written "when you take away their breath, they die and return to the dust. When you send your Spirit, they are created. (Ps. 104:29,30).
- 125. The presence of God's Spirit everywhere is in (Ps. 139:7-10).
- 126. The eternal nature of the Spirit is found in (Heb. 9:14).
- 127. St. Peter said, "how is it that Satan has so filled your heart that you have lied to the Holy Spirit ... You have not lied to men but to God" (Acts 5:3,4).
- 128. The Holy Spirit calls to service for He said, "set apart for Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them" (Acts 13:2).
- 129. The Holy Spirit is with the Holy Synod as the apostles said about the decisions of the first Holy Synod, "It seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us ... " (Acts 15:28).
- 130. "For it will not be you speaking, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you" (Matt. 10:20).
- 131. The Holy Spirit reminds us of all that the Lord said (John. 14:26).
- 132. The Holy Spirit forgives sins on the mouth of the priest. That is why the Lord Christ told His disciples, "Receive

- the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven ..." (John. 20:22,23).
- 133. The Holy Spirit gives the second birth through baptism (John. 3:5).
- 134. "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon Me, because the Lord has anointed Me. He has sent Me to bring good news ... " (Isa. 61:1).
- 135. Anyone who lies to the apostles lies to the Holy Spirit as in the story of Ananias and Sapphira (Acts 5:3,4).

BEING FILLED WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT

- 136. Peter was filled with the Holy Spirit (Acts 4:8).
- 137. The worshippers were filled with the Holy Spirit (Acts 4:31).
- 138. The seven men who were filled with the Holy Spirit and with wisdom were the seven deacons (Acts 6:3).
- 139. The disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost (Acts 2:4).
- 140. Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit when she heard the greeting of the Virgin Mary (Luke. 1:41).
- 141. It was St. John the Baptist of which it was announced that "he will be filled with the Holy Spirit even from birth" (Luke. 1:15).
- 142. In (Luke. 4:1) it is written, "Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan
- 143. It was said of St. Stephen, the first deacon, that when he was stoned, "Stephen, full of the Holy Spirit, looked up to heaven and saw the glory of God..." (Acts 7:55).

144. Zechariah, the priest, when the period of his dumbness was over, "was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied" (Luke. 1:67).



FASTING

- 145. All the people fasted in the days of Queen Esther (Esther) and all the people of Ninevah fasted also (,Jon. 3).
- 146. It Is written "The time will come when the bridegroom will be taken away from them; then they will fast" (Matt. 9:15).
- 147. Vegetarian food in paradise (Gen. 1:29), and outside paradise when the Lord said to Adam, "and you will eat the plants of the field" (Gen. 3:18).
- 148. Manna was the vegetarian food in the wilderness of Sinai (Ex. 16:31).
- 149. Daniel, when he fasted, did not eat any meat or rich food (Dan. 10:3).
- 150. Fasting with humiliation is mentioned in the fast called for by Joel the prophet (Joel 2:12,13).
- 151. As for set times for fasting, Zechariah, the prophet, set the fast of the fourth month, the fifth month, the seventh month, and the fast of the tenth month (Zech. 8:19).



WAYS IN WHICH GOD SPOKE

- 152. God spoke to Job out of the storm (Job 38:1).
- 153. God spoke to Moses from fire, from the burning bush (Ex. 3:2,4).
- 154. God spoke to Elijah in a gentle whisper (1 Kin. 19:12,13).
- 155. God spoke to Moses from the tabernacle (Lev. 1:1).
- 156. God spoke from the heavens at the baptism of Lord Christ (Matt. 3:17).
- 157. God spoke to Moses from thunder and lightning (Ex. 19:16-20).
- 158. God spoke to the prophet Ezekiel from above the four creatures and the sparkling dome near the River Chebar (Ezek. 1:5,28).
- 159. God spoke from heaven with a voice like thunder saying, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again" in Jerusalem on Palm Sunday (John.12:12,15,28,29).
- 160. God spoke to the people from the mountain in His Sermon (Matt. 5:1,2).
- 161. God spoke to Moses from the thick darkness (Ex. 20:21, 22).



GOD'S PROMISE

- 162. The commandment to honor your father and mother is the first one with a promise (Eph. 6:2).
- 163. God promised David to establish a house for him and his descendant would sit on his seat and his kingdom will be established (2 Sam. 7:12). The condition is "When he does wrong, I will punish him... but My love will never be taken away from him, as I took it away from Saul (2 Sam. 7:14,15).
- 164. The Lord promised His disciples that they would see Him and rejoice (John. 16:22) and this promise was fulfilled after the Resurrection. He promised them to send the Holy Spirit (John. 15:26) and this promise was fulfilled on the Pentecost (Acts 2).
- 165. The Lord considered pain a promise as He said about Saul of Tarsus, "I will show him how much he must suffer for My name" (Acts 9:16). As for pain being a blessing and leading to glory, St. Paul says, "If indeed we share in His sufferings in order that we may also share in His glory" (Rom. 8:17).
- 166. God promised in His letter to the church of Ephesus, "To everyone who conquers, I will give permission to eat from the tree of life" (Rev. 2:7).



AFTER THE RESURRECTION

- 167. The appearance of the Lord to Mary Magdalene is mentioned in (Mark. 16:9) (Matt. 28:1-9).
- 168. The appearance of the Lord to Peter and more than 500 brothers is mentioned in (1 Cor.15:5-7).
- 169. His appearance to Thomas is mentioned in (John. 20:27).
- 170. His appearance to Saul of Tarsus is mentioned in (Acts 9:1-5).
- 171. His appearance to the two disciples of Emmaus is mentioned in (Luke. 24:13-15).
- 172. His appearance to the disciples is mentioned in (John. 20:19,20) (1 Cor. 15).
- 173. The Lord appearance to seven of His disciples at the Sea of Tiberias is mentioned in (John. 21:1-5).
- 174. His appearance to 500 brothers is mentioned in (1 Cor. 15:6).
- 175. The Lord appeared to His disciples in the upper room (John. 20:19,26). He appeared to them in Galilee (Matt. 28:10,16,17), He appeared at the Sea of Tiberias (John. 21:1), in Bethany (Luke. 24:50), and on the Mount of Olives when He ascended (Acts 1:9,12).
- 176. The Lord Christ granted His disciples the Sacrament of the Priesthood when He breathed on their faces saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive ..." (John. 20:19-23). This took place in the upper room after the Resurrection.

177. Yes, Mary Magdalene touched the Lord's feet and worshipped Him after the Resurrection (Matt. 28:1,9).



WOMEN

- 178. Among the most famous women who knew the Lord and met Him were: first, of course, the Virgin Mary: then Mary Magdalene, Mary the wife of Clopas, and the mother of James and John, the sons of Zebedee.
- 179. The women who stood at the foot of His cross were:St. Mary His mother, her sister the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene (John. 19:25).
- I80. The woman whose house became the first church was Mary the mother of John, surnamed Mark, (the mother of St, Mark, the apostle) (Acts 12:12).
- 181. The one who poured an expensive perfume of pure nard on Lord Christ's feet was Mary, the sister of Martha and Lazarus (John. 12:2,3).
- 182. Lord Christ wept when He saw Mary, the sister of Martha and Lazarus, weeping (John. 11:31-35).
- 183. The woman who asked that her sons sit, one on the right side and one on the left side of the Lord, is the mother of the sons of Zebedee, James and John (Matt. 20:20-21).
- 184. The wife of the Steward of Herod was Joanna, the wife of Chuza (Luke. 8:3).
- 185. The woman from whom the Lord cast out sevendevils was Mary Magdalene (Mark. 16:9) (Luke. 8:2).
- 186. The names of the four prophetesses are: Miriam, the sister of Moses (Ex. 15:20). Deborah (Judg. 4:4). Huldah (2 Kin. 22:14) (2 Chr. 34:22), and Anna (Luke. 2:36).

- 187. The saintly queen was Queen Esther (the Book of Esther) and the evil queen was Jezebel (1 Kin. 21).
- 188. Four women entered the ark: Noah's wife, and the wives of his three sons (Gen. 7:7).
- 189. Elkanah had two wives, Hannah, Samuel's mother, and Peninnah (1 Sam. 1:2).
- 190. The first woman whom David married was Michal, Saul's daughter (1 Sam. 18:20-27) and her punishment for despising her husband, David, was to be barren (2 Sam. 26:59).
- 191. Jezebel was the wife who was both very intelligent and very evil and she caused her husband, Ahab, to perish (1 Kin. 19,21).
- 192. The wives who were barren and to whom the Lord granted children were: Sarah (Gen. 19), Rachel (Gen. 30:1,22), Hannah, Samuel's mother (1 Sam. 1), and Elizabeth, Zechariah's wife (Luke. 1).
- 193. It was forbidden to marry foreign women in the (Book of Exodus 34), (the Book of Proverbs 5:3,29), (the Book of Nehemiah 10:73). and (the Book of Ezra 29:12).
- 194. The foreign wives of King Solomon caused him to be lost (1 Kin. 11).
- 195. The sons of God, sons of (Seth) married the daughters of men (the descendants of Cain) (Gen. 2:6) before the flood, and the result was the anger of God and the flood.
- 196. Abraham married Sarah, Hager and Keturah. The one who had most of the children was Keturah (Gen. 25:1, 2) who bore him six sons. The Lord told him "Listen to whatever Sarah tells you" (Gen. 21:12).



MOTHERS

- 197. Our mother, Eve, had three sons: Cain, Abel, and Seth (Gen. 4:25,26), and our Lord Christ descended from Seth.
- 198. Sarah was ninety years old when she bore Isaac and Abraham was hundred (Gen. 21:2-5).
- 199. The mother of Moses was called Jochebed (Num. 26:59).
- 200. St. Timothy's mother was called Eunice and his grandmother was called Lois (2 Tim, 1:5).
- 201. Hannah was the mother who wept and prayed to God to give her a son, whom she would dedicate to Him (1 Sam. 10:11) and the Lord gave her Samuel.
- 202. Mary, the mother of Mark, had a son who became an apostle, and her house became a church (Acts 12:12).
- 203. The mother of James and John, the sons of Zebedee, had a son who became a martyr i.e. James (Acts 12:1) and her other son, John, did not martyred, but suffered so much that he is considered one of the confessors.
- 204. The mother who fled with her son to another country to escape from the king's plot to kill him was the Virgin Mary who came to Egypt to escape from Herod the king.



THE VIRGIN MARY

- 205. The Virgin comes from Nazareth of Galilee (Luke. 1:26).
- 206. She returned to Nazareth after the death of Herod (Matt. 2:22-23).
- 207. The name of the Virgin's sister is mentioned among those who stood at the foot of the cross; her husband is Clopas (John. 19:25), and her children are James, the younger, Joses, and Salome (Mark. 15:40).
- 208. The Virgin Mary Lived with St. John after the Lord's crucifixion (John. 19:27).
- 209. The Virgin Mary interceded in the miracle of changing the water into wine, at the wedding of Cana of Galilee (John. 2:3).
- 210. It is written that the Virgin was praying with the disciples of the Lord (Acts 1:14).
- 211. The Virgin stayed with Elizabeth three months during her pregnancy, for when the angel announced the birth of the Lord to Her, Elizabeth was in her sixth month (Luke. 1:36).
- 212. The Annunciation by the angel to the Virgin Mary is mentioned in (Luke 1:26-38). The angel told Joseph of this virgin birth in (Matthew 1:20-23).
- 213. It is written in (Isa. 7:14), "A virgin will be with child and will give birth to a Son, and will call Him Emmanuel".
- 214. It is mentioned that the Virgin asked to meet Lord Jesus Christ in (Matt. 12:46,47).

- 215. "When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit" (Luke. 1:41).
- 216. It was mentioned that the Virgin also needed to be saved, when she said in her magnificent "and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior" (Luke. 1:47).



CHILDREN

- 217. The verse that indicates that children are a gift from God is when Jacob spoke to Esau about his children saying, "the children God has graciously given your servant" (Gen. 33:5), and Job the righteous, when his children died, said "the Lord gave and the Lord has taken away" (Job 1:21).
- 218. The first son to be given by God in fulfillment of a promise is Isaac, the son of Abraham (Gen. 17:15,19), (Gen. 18:10).
- 219. The son whose mother dedicated to the Lordbefore his birth was Samuel (1 Sam. 1:1).
- 220. The son whose parents were told by the angel that he would be dedicated to God was Samson (Judg. 13:7).
- 221. Elisha the prophet promised the Shunamite woman who was barren that she would have a son (2 Kin. 4:16,17).
- 222. The son whom God chose to be a prophet while he was still in his mother's womb was Jeremiah (Jer. 1:5).
- 223. The Lord Christ blessed a child and held him up as an example to the disciples (Matt. 18:3).
- 224. The child who served in the Temple from hischildhood is Samuel (1 Sam. 1:21-28).
- 225. On the punishment of those who are a stumbling block to children, Lord Christ said. "But if anyone causes one of those little ones who believe in Me to sin, it would be better for him to have a large millstone hung around his

- neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea" (Matt. 18:6).
- 226. The Lord defended the children on Palm Sunday saying, "Have you never read "From the lips of children and infants you have ordained praise" (Matt. 21:16).
- 227. The Lord said, "Let the little children come to Me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these" (Luke. 18:16).
- 228. A child offered five loaves and two fish (John. 6:9).
- 229. The Lord talked to the elders in the Temple at Jerusalem for He was "sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. Everyone who heard Him was amazed at His understanding and His answers" (Luke. 2:46,47).
- 230. It is written in (Mark 10:14,16) that the Lord took the children up in His arms, put His hands on them and blessed them.
- 231. Two women quarreled over a child (1 Kin. 3:16-27) and king Solomon judged between them; he gave the child to the woman who did not want him killed.
- 232. In the Old Testament, a child was to be circumcised on the eighth day (Gen. 17:12).
- 233. The first-born children were saved by the killing of the Passover lamb and its blood on the lintel and on the two door posts (Ex. 12:21-23).
- 234. The child who learned the Scriptures when young was Timothy, St. Paul's disciple (2 Tim, 3:15).
- 235. Simon carried the infant Jesus (Luke. 2:28) and Anna the prophetess prophesied about Him (Luke.2:36-38).
- 236. The child Jesus Christ and the child John the Baptist were saved from Herod.



KINGS AND PROPHETS

- 237. Ahab the king was annoyed by the prophecy 'of Micaiah, the prophet, (1 Kin. 22:27).
- 238. David was both king and prophet.
- 239. The Lord said about John the Baptist that he was greater than prophet (Matt. 11:9).
- 240. Jochebed was the woman who bore a prophet, Moses, a prophetess, Miraim and a High Priest, Aaron.
- 241. King Jeroboam and king Ahab were the two kings who spread the worship of idols the most (1 Kin. 12:33).
- 242. John the Baptist rebuked king Herod for sin, and so Herod beheaded him (Matt. 14).
- 243. Micaiah, the prophet, rebuked king Ahab and was imprisoned.
- 244. Nathan, the prophet, rebuked king David for sin and David confessed his sin (1 Sam. 12:13).
- 245. Elijah, the prophet, convicted king Ahab and Ahab tore his clothes, put on sackcloth and fasted (1 Kin. 21:27).
- 246. God appeared to King Solomon twice (1 Kin. 9:2) and Solomon blessed the people (1 Kin. 8:55).
- 247. King Darius ordered, reluctantly, that Daniel be thrown into the lions' den, and he was so sad that he couldn't sleep that night (Da. 6:14-18).
- 248. The angel of the Lord smote Herod because he did not give glory to God, so the worms ate him and he died (Acts 12:23).

- 249. Josiah the king was the good king who removed all worship of idol in his reign (2 Chr. 34:3-7).
- 250. Lord Jesus Christ is called King of kings and Lord of lords in (Rev. 19:16).
- 251. The first king to be loved by God was David.
- 252. Herod the king married the wife of his brother, Philip. John the Baptist condemned him for this, saying, "It is not lawful for you to have her" (Matt. 14:4).
- 253. The king of Sodom was taken captive and was rescued by Abraham (Gen. 14).
- 254. Hazekiah was faced with a serious problem and Isaiah, the prophet, interceded and the angel of God delivered them from the Assyrian army (2 Kin. 19:1,6,35).
- 255. Ahab the king, returned to his house sullen and displeased because Naboth the Jezreelite refused to sell him his vineyard (1 Kin. 21:4).



CHURCH SACRAMENTS


- 256. The effectiveness of baptism and the new birth or the second birth are mentioned in John 3: 3, 5 and Titus 3: 5.
- 257. The power of baptism for the forgiveness of sins is found in (Acts 2:38), and the washing of sin is found in (Acts 22:16).
- 258. On baptism & salvation: "He who believes and is baptized will be saved" (Mark. 16:16): "He saved us through the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit" (Tit. 3:5); see also (1 Pet. 3:20,21).
- 259. On the Sacrament of Anointing of the sick: "Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church and let them pray over him anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven" (Jas, 5:14,15).
- 260. The Sacrament of Marriage: "Therefore what God has joined together, let man not separate" (Matt. 19:6).
- 261. On the Holy Anointing: (1 John. 2:20,27).
- 262. Of John the Baptist, it is written "They were baptized by him in the Jordan, confessing their sins" (Matt. 3:6), and "Many of those who had believed came confessing and telling their deeds" (Acts 19:18).



WORSHIP IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

- 263. Moses made the Tabernacle just as the Lord had told him, "Make this tabernacle and all its furnishings exactly like the pattern I will show you" (Ex. 25:9), and so they did, " as the Lord commanded Moses: (Ex. 39:1,21,31). "Moses inspected the work and saw that they had done it just as the Lord had commanded. So Moses blessed them" (Ex. 39:43).
- 264. The pictures in Solomon's Temple are mentioned in (1 Kin. 7:17-36) and they were of lions, bulls, cherubim, palms, and garlands of flowers (1 Kin. 17:25,29,36) as well as networks of chains (1 Kin. 7:17), and images of gourds and lily blossoms (1 Kin. 7:24-26).
- 265. There were two cherubim's of gold above the Ark (Ex. 25:18-20).
- 266. The reason why pictures and statues were forbidden was to prevent people worshipping them, "you shall not bow down to them or worship them" (Ex. 20:4,5).
- 267. Aaron and his sons were anointed with the sacred oil for the priesthood (Ex. 40:13,14).
- 268. The Lord said to Moses, "Make holy garments for Aaron your brother, for glory and for beauty" (Ex. 28:2).
- 269. Saul was anointed king (1 Sam. 10:1) and so was David (1 Sam. 16:13) Hazael and Jehu were also anointed kings (1 Kin. 19:15,16).

- 270. Elijah, the prophet, was commanded by God to anoint Elisha to succeed him as prophet (1 Kin. 19:16).
- 271. The Lord said to Moses, "Take the anointing oil and anoint the tabernacle and everything in it, consecrate it and all its furnishings, and it will be holy. Then anoint the altar of burnt offering, and all its utensils: consecrate the altar, and it will be most holy" (Ex. 40:9,10).
- 272. As for the making of incense and its consecration, it is written, "It shall be for you most holy. When you make incense according to this composition you shall not make it for yourselves; it shall be regarded by you as holy to the Lord" (Ex. 30:34,37).



FROM THE PARABLES OF THE LORD


- 273. The parable of the Pharisee and the tax-collector is on humility (Luke. 18:13).
- 274. The parable of the widow and the judge is about praying at all times (Luke. 18:1-7).
- 275. The parable of the foolish rich man is about sudden death (Luke. 12:20).
- 276. The parable of the good Samaritan is about compassion (Luke. 10:33).
- 277. The parable of the unjust steward is about wisdom (Luke. 16:8).
- 278. The parable of the growing seed is about growth (Mark. 4:28).
- 279. The parable of the wise and foolish virgins is about being ready (Matt. 25).
- 280. We should be spiritually watchful like the servants who are waiting for their master (Luke. 12:37).



WORK

- 281. The first mention of work was the work of creation (Gen. 1) (Gen. 2:1-3). As for men, God placed Adam in the garden of Eden "to till it and keep it" (Gen. 2:15).
- 282. A verse about success at work is found in (Psalm 1). It was also said of Joseph, "the Lord gave himsuccess in everything he did" (Gen. 39:3).
- 283. About faithfulness in work, the Lord said of Moses, "Not so with My servant Moses, he is entrusted with all My house" (Num. 12:7). The Lord also said, "Who then is the faithful and wise manager, whom his master will put in charge of his servants to give them their food allowance at the proper time? It will be good for that servant whom the master finds doing so when he returns" (Luke. 12:42,43). He said, "Be faithful, until death and I will give you the crown of life" (Rev. 2:10).
- 284. About laxity in work, the Bible says, "Accursed is the one who is slack in doing the Lord's work" (Jer. 48:10). And about laziness, it says, "Go to the ant, you lazybones, consider its ways and be wise" (Prov. 6:6) and also, "How long will you lie there, 0 lazybones? When will you get up from your sleep?" (Prov. 6:9).
- 285. About working with God, St. Paul says of himself and his co-worker, Apollos, "For we are laborers together with God" (1 Cor. 3:9).

- 286. About perfection, the Lord said, "Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matt. 5:48).
- 287. About doing good on the Sabbath (Mark. 3:4,5) and (Luke. 13:14-16).
- 288. "Faith without works is dead" (Jas. 2:17,20).
- 289. In the Book of Ecclesiastes, it is written, "For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven" (Ecc. 3:1).
- 290. It is written "For the Son of Man will come in the glory of His Father with His angels, and then He will reward each according to his works" (Matt. 16:27).
- 291. The Lord said to each of the angels of the seven churches, "I know your works" (Rev. 2:2,9,13,19) and (Rev. 3:1,8,15).



GIVING

- 292. The commandment to give tithes is mentioned in (Deut. 12:6), and (Deut- 14:22). Before that, Abraham gave tithes to Melechizedek (Gen. 14:20).
- 293. As for giving more than the tithes, our Lord said, "For I say to you, that unless your righteousness exceeds that of the Scribes and Pharisees, you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 5:20). These paid tithes. Our Lord also said, "Give to him who asks you" (Matt. 5:42). He said to the rich young man, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell your possessions and give to the poor (Matt.19:21).
- 294. Giving the first fruits is mentioned in (Ex. 22 : 29), (Ex. 23:16), and (Ex. 13:2,12).
- 295. The widow who gave out of her poverty' is mentioned in (Mark. 12:44). (Luke. 21:4).
- 296. About not coming to the Lord empty-handed (Ex. 23:15), it is written "No man should appear before the Lord empty-handed. Each of you must bring a gift in proportion to the way the Lord your God has blessed you" (Deut. 16:16,17).
- 297. "If a man shuts his ears to the cry of the poor, he too will cry and not be answered" (Prov. 21:13).
- 298. "But when you do a charitable deed, do not let your left hand know what you right hand is doing, so that your charitable deed may be in secret" (Matt. 6:3,4).


- 299. "If your enemy is hungry, feed him, if he is thirsty, give him something to drink" (Rom. 12:20).
- 300. "God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor. 9:7).
- 301. "When you reap the harvest of your land, do not reap to the very edges of your field or gather the gleanings of your harvest ... for the poor and the alien" (Lev. 19:9,10), and also "When you are harvesting in your field and you overlook a sheaf, do not go back to get it. Leave it for the alien, the fatherless and the widow, so that the Lord your God may bless you in all the work of your hands" (Deut. 24:19).
- 302. The Lord said "It is more blessed to give than to receive (Acts 20:35).
- 303. About giving oneself for one's beloved ones, the Lord said, "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends" (John. 15:13).
- 304- Giving one's heart to God is mentioned in the verse, "My son, give me your heart" (Prov. 23:26).
- 305. "He who gives, with liberality" (Rom. 12:2,8), "Command those who are rich ... that they be rich in good works, ready to give, willing to share" (1 Tim. 6:17,18).



PERSONALITIES

- 306. There are seven people in the gospels with the name of Simon:
 - 1. Simon Peter, the disciple (Matt. 10).
 - 2. Simon, Jesus kinsman (Matt. 13:55).
 - 3. Simon the Elder (Luke. 2:25-35).
 - 4. Simon the Cyrene (Matt. 27:32).
 - 5. Simon the Leper (Matt. 26:6-13).
 - 6. Simon the Pharisee (Luke. 7:36).
 - 7. Simon the father of Judas Iscariot (John. 6:71).
- 307. There are three people in the Bible with the name of James:
 - 1. James the son of Zebedee, the brother of John (Matt. 10:2).
 - 2. James the son of Alphaeus (Matt. 10:3).
 - 3. Jacob, the Patriarch (John. 4:12).
- 308. Rufus is the son of Simon the Cyrene (Mark. 15:21). He is mentioned in St. Paul's epistle to the Romans (Rom. 16:13).
- 309. Chuza was Herod's steward, and his wife, Joanna, was one of the women who served the Lord out of their own means.
- 310. Four people were chosen by God while they were still in their mothers' wombs:
 - 1. Jeremiah the prophet (Jer. 1:5).
 - 2. Jacob the patriarch (Rom. 9:11-13).

- 3. John the Baptist (Luke. 1:15).
- 4. Saul of Tarsus (St. Paul) (Gal. 1:15).
- 311. Shimei son of Gera gloated at David when he was fleeing from Absalom, his son, and cursed David (2 Sam. 16:5-8).
- 312. The daughters of men (Gen. 6:2) are those who descended from Cain.
- 313. It was said of Nimrod that he was a mighty one on the earth, and that he was a mighty hunter before the Lord (Gen. 10:8,9).
- 314. The father of Nimrod was Cush and the beginning of his kingdom was Babel (Gen. 10:8,10).



ABOUT LORD JESUS

- 315. Lord Christ said when He was talking to Nicodemus, "No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven ... the Son of Man" (John. 3:13).
- 316. "And surely I am with you always to the very end of the age" (Matt. 28:20), and "For where two or three are come together in My name, I am there in the midst of them" (Matt. 18:20).
- 317. The Lord says, "Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with him, and he with Me" (Rev. 3:20).
- 318. The Lord said, "I and the Father are one" (John. 10:30).
- 319. The Son said to the Father, "And now, Father, glorify Me in Your presence with the glory I had with You before the world began" (John. 17:5).
- 320. The gospel says about Lord Christ, "Through Him all things were made: without Him nothing was made that was made" (John. 1:3).
- 321. St. Paul said about the Jews, "and from them is traced the human ancestry of Christ, who is God over all, forever praised! Amen" (Rom. 9:5); also "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (Jr. 1:1). St. Thomas, the disciple, said to Him, "My Lord and my God!" (John. 20:28) and the Lord accepted this from him as evidence of his faith. Also see (Isa. 9:5) and (Heb. 1:7-8).

- 322. "Who has gone into heaven and is at God's right hand... with angels, authorities and powers in submission to Him" (1 Pet. 3:21,22).
- 323. "and angels ministered to Him" (Mark. 1:13) and (Matt. 4:11).
- 324. "That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and earth and under the earth" (Phil. 2:10), see also (Heb. 1:6).
- 325. The angels are His. "The Son of man will send out His angels..." (Matt. 13:41), also, "And He will send His angels with a loud trumpet call, and they will gather His elect from the four winds" (Matt. 24:31).
- 326. He sent them out and they feared Him and shouted in fear of Him (Mark. 1:22,24), (Mark. 3:11). (Luke.8:28), and (Matt. 8:29).
- 327. About the Lord's authority over the law, He said, "You have heard that it was said to the people long ago ... but I tell you ... " (Matt. 5:22,27,32,34,39,44). He also said, "A new command I give you (John. 13:34).
- 328. About the Lord's authority over life and death, the apostle Paul says, "... our Savior, Christ Jesus, who has destroyed death and has brought life and immortality to light through the gospel" (2 Tim. 1:10). The Lord also said, "And I hold the keys of death and Hades" (Rev. 1:18); and He said, "I am the resurrection and the life" (John. 11:25,26).
- 329. The Lord had authority over the sea and the waters, "Peace! Be still!" And the wind ceased and there was a great calm" (Mark. 4:37,39). He also walked on the water (Matt. 14:25,32).
- 330. He had authority over diseases and could heal all sorts of diseases and every weakness in the people. It is written

- "and people brought to Him all who were ill with various diseases, those suffering severe pain, the demonpossessed, those having seizures, and the paralyzed, and He healed them" (Matt. 4:23,24).
- 331. He said, "For the Son of Man is Lord also of the Sabbath" (Matt. 12:8).
- 332. It is written that the kingdom is His (Matt. 16:28), (Matt. 13:41,42), (Matt. 24:31).
- 333. He accepted that the man born blind bow down and worship Him (John. 9:38), and those in the ship also worshipped Him when He walked on the water and told Him, "Truly You are the Son of God" (Matt. 14:33). The eleven also worshipped Him after the Resurrection (Matt. 28:17) and so did the two Marys (Matt. 28:7).
- 334. "After Lord Jesus had spoken to them. He was received up into heaven and He sat down at the right hand of God" (Mark. 16:19). St. Stephen witnessed this (Acts 7:56) and it is written in (Ps. 110:1).
- 335. It is written that He is God's Only-Begotten Son (John. 3:16), (John. 3:18), (John. 1:18), (1 John. 49).
- 336. He said, "I am the Alpha and Omega" (Rev. 1:11). See also (Rev. 22:13) and (Rev. 1:8,17).
- 337. A verse about unintentional sin is (Lev. 4:2).
- 338. Job said, "I made a covenant with my eyes not to look lustfully at a girl" (Job 31:1).
- 339. A verse about the sin of thought is "The devising of foolishness is sin" (Prov. 24:9).
- 340. Two verses about sins against God are: "Against You and You only have I sinned" (Ps. 51:4) and "How then could I do such a wicked thing and sin against God?" (Gen. 39:9).
- 341. "The fool says in his heart "There is no God" (Ps. 14:1).

- 342. "Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up"(1 Cor. 8:1).
- 343. Eternal punishment of sin is "The wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23). 'This is how it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come and separate the wicked from the righteous and throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth" (Matt. 13:49,50).
- 344. Earthly punishment is like David's punishment (2 Sam. 12), (2 Sam. 24) and also Solomon's punishment (1 Kin. 11:11-13).
- 345. The sinner is spiritually dead as the angel of the Lord says to the church of Sardis "you have a reputation of being alive, but you are dead" (Rev. 3:1), and as the father of the lost son repenting said of him, "this brother of yours was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found" (Luke. 15:24,32).
- 346. "Blessed are they whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sin is covered. Blessed is the man whose sin the Lord will never count against him" (Rom. 4:7,8), and also (Ps. 132:1,2), (Ps. 32:1,2), (Jer. 31:34), (2 Cor. 5:19).



MISCELLANEOUS

- 347. St. Paul raised the youth, Eutychus, from the dead (Acts 20:9-11).
- 348. St. Peter raised Tabitha from the dead (Acts 9:40.41).
- 349. St. Paul wrote his epistles by the hand of T'ychicus, Epaphroditus, Onesimus, and Timothy (the letters are to the Ephesians, Phillipians, Phillipi, Colossians, Philemon and Hebrews).
- 350. The three who each fasted forty days are:
 - 1. Lord Jesus Christ (Matt. 4:2).
 - 2. Moses the prophet (Ex. 34:28).
 - 3. Elijah (1 Kin. 19:8).
- 351. The Lord Christ, Moses and Elijah met together onthe Mount of Transfiguration. (Mark. 9:4).
- 352. The High Priest's servant whose ear St. Peter cut off was called Malchus (John. 18:10).
- 353. The two called John are John the Baptist and John the Evangelist. The two called Joseph are Joseph the Carpenter and Joseph of Aramithea.
- 354. The two verses from the New Testament about incense are:
 - 1. It is said about the twenty-four elders in the Book of Revelation. "Each one had a harp and were holding golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints" (Rev. 5:8).

2. "Another angel, who had a golden censer, came and stood at the altar. He was given much incense to offer, with the prayers of all the saints... The smoke of the incense, together with the prayers of the saints, went up before God" (Rev. 8:3,4).
